

<b>VENUE IN JUSTICE COURT SUITS</b>	
General Rule (15.082)	County and precinct where one or more of the Defendants reside.
Suit for Rent (15.091)	Precinct in which all or part of the property is located
Suit on a Tort (15.093)	(a) Suit on a <i>written contract that promises performance</i> may be brought in the precinct where the labor was to be performed. (b) Suit on an <i>oral or written contract for labor actually performed</i> may be brought in the precinct where the labor was actually performed. (c) Suit on a contract for goods, services, or loans for personal, family or household use may be brought where the contract was signed or where the Defendant resides.
Suit on a Contract (15.092)	Precinct in which the property is located.
Suit against Corporation or Association (15.94)	Precinct where: (a) All or part of the cause of action arose. (b) The corporation has an agency or representative, or (c) The principle office is located
Insurance Companies (15.096)	Precinct in which all or part of the insured property is located in the case of a property claim. Precinct where the injured person resided when the injury or death occurred.
